3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Family Cord Blood
- 5 Banking Act of 2011".

1SEC. 2. AMOUNTS PAID FOR UMBILICAL CORD BLOOD2BANKING SERVICES TREATED AS MEDICAL3CARE EXPENSES.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Paragraph (1) of section 213(d)
5 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (defining medical
6 care) is amended by striking "or" at the end of subpara7 graph (C), by striking the period at the end of subpara8 graph (D) and inserting ", or", and by inserting after sub9 paragraph (D) the following new subparagraph:

10 "(E) for private umbilical cord blood bank11 ing services provided by any accredited umbil12 ical cord blood bank which is in compliance
13 with the regulations under section 361 of the
14 Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 264).".

(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
this section shall apply to taxable years beginning after
December 31, 2011.

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
