A BILL

To prevent the illegal sale of firearms.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Trafficking Reduction
- 5 And Criminal Enforcement (TRACE) Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. REGULATORY REQUIREMENT TO MARK FIREARMS
- 7 WITH SECOND, HIDDEN SERIAL NUMBER.
- 8 Within 12 months after the date of the enactment
- 9 of this Act, the Attorney General shall promulgate final
- 10 regulations that require each firearm manufactured in the
- 11 United States on or after the effective date of the regula-

2	inside the barrel of the firearm or that is visible only in
