3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "United States Cadet
- 5 Nurse Corps Equity Act".

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—For purposes of section
4 401(a)(1)(A) of the GI Bill Improvement Act of 1977 (38
5 U.S.C. 106 note), the Secretary of Defense is deemed to
6 have determined that qualified service of a person con7 stituted active military service.

8 (b) DETERMINATION OF DISCHARGE STATUS.—The 9 Secretary of Defense shall issue an honorable discharge 10 under section 401(a)(1)(B) of the GI Bill Improvement 11 Act of 1977 to each person whose qualified service war-12 rants an honorable discharge. Such discharge shall be 13 issued before the end of the one-year period beginning on 14 the date of the enactment of this Act.

15 SEC. 3. PROHIBITION OF RETROACTIVE BENEFITS.

16 No benefits may be paid to any person as a result17 of the enactment of this Act for any period before the date18 of the enactment of this Act.

19 SEC. 4. DEFINITION.

For purposes of this Act, the term "qualified service" means service of a person as a member of the organization known as the United States Cadet Nurse Corps during the period beginning on July 1, 1943, and ending on December 15, 1945.
