3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Tom Lantos Pul-5 monary Hypertension Research and Education Act of 6 2011".

TITLE I—RESEARCH ON PULMONARY HYPERTENSION

3 SEC. 101. EXPANSION AND INTENSIFICATION OF ACTIVI-

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5 (a) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of the Con6 gress that—

(1) the Secretary of Health and Human Services (in this Act referred to as the "Secretary"), acting through the Director of the National Institutes
of Health and the Director of the National Heart,
Lung, and Blood Institute (in this title referred to
as the "Institute"), should continue aggressive work
on pulmonary hypertension;

(2) as part of such work, the Director of the Institute should continue research to expand the understanding of the causes of, and to find a cure for,
pulmonary hypertension; and

18 (3) activities under paragraph (1) may include19 conducting and supporting—

1	(A) basic research concerning the etiology
2	and causes of pulmonary hypertension;
3	(B) basic research on the relationship be-
4	tween scleroderma, sickle cell anemia (and other
5	conditions identified by the Director of the In-
6	stitute that can lead to a secondary diagnosis of
7	pulmonary hypertension), and pulmonary hy-
8	pertension;
9	(C) clinical research for the development
10	and evaluation of new treatments for pul-
11	monary hypertension, including the establish-
12	ment of a "Pulmonary Hypertension Clinical
13	Research Network'';
14	(D) support for the training of new clini-
15	cians and investigators with expertise in the
16	pulmonary hypertension; and
17	(E) information and education programs
18	for the general public.
19	(b) BIENNIAL REPORTS.—As part of the biennial re-
20	port made under section 403 of the Public Health Service
21	Act (42 U.S.C. 283), the Secretary shall include informa-
22	tion on the status of pulmonary hypertension research at
23	the National Institutes of Health.

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4 SEC. 201. PROMOTING PUBLIC AWARENESS.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary, acting through the
6 Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Preven7 tion, shall carry out an educational campaign to increase
8 public awareness of pulmonary hypertension. Print, video,
9 and Web-based materials distributed under this program
10 may include—

11	(1) basic	information	on	pulmonary	hyper-
12	tension and its	symptoms; and	d		

- 13 (2) information on—
- 14 (A) the incidence and prevalence of pul-15 monary hypertension;

16 (B) diseases and conditions that can lead
17 to pulmonary hypertension as a secondary diag18 nosis;

19 (C) the importance of early diagnosis; and
20 (D) the availability, as medically appro21 priate, of a range of treatment options and pul22 monary hypertension.

(b) DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION.—The Secretary is encouraged to disseminate information under
subsection (a) through a cooperative agreement with a na-

tional nonprofit entity with expertise in pulmonary hyper tension.

3 (c) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—Not later than Sep-4 tember 30, 2012, the Secretary shall report to the Com-5 mittee on Energy and Commerce of the House of Rep-6 resentatives, the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, 7 and Pensions of the Senate, and the Committees on Ap-8 propriations of the House of Representatives and the Sen-9 ate on the status of activities under this section.

(d) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—For the
purpose of carrying out this section, there is authorized
to be appropriated \$2,500,000 for each of fiscal years
2012, 2013, and 2014.

14 SEC. 202. PROMOTING AWARENESS AMONG HEALTH CARE 15 PROFESSIONALS.

16 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary, acting through the 17 Administrator of the Health Resources and Services Ad-18 ministration and the Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, shall carry out an educational 19 20 campaign to increase awareness of pulmonary hyper-21 tension among health care providers. Print, video, and 22 Web-based materials distributed under this program may 23 include information on—

24 (1) the symptoms of pulmonary hypertension;

25 (2) the importance of early diagnosis;

(3) current diagnostic criteria; and

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2 (4) Food and Drug Administration-approved3 therapies for the disease.

4 (b) TARGETED HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS.—Health
5 care providers targeted through the campaign under sub6 section (a) shall include, but not be limited to, cardiolo7 gists, pulmonologists, rheumatologists, primary care phy8 sicians, pediatricians, and nurse practitioners.

9 (c) DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION.—The Sec-10 retary is encouraged to disseminate information under 11 subsection (a) through a cooperative agreement with a na-12 tional nonprofit entity with expertise in pulmonary hyper-13 tension.

(d) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—Not later than September 30, 2012, the Secretary shall report to the Committee on Energy and Commerce of the House of Representatives, the Committee on Health, Education, Labor,
and Pensions of the Senate, and the Committees on Appropriations of the House of Representatives and the Senate on the status of activities under this section.

(e) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—For the
purpose of carrying out this section, there is authorized
to be appropriated \$2,500,000 for each of fiscal years
2012, 2013, and 2014.
