A BILL

- To ensure that local educational agencies and units of local governments are compensated for tax revenues lost when the Federal Government takes land into trust for the benefit of a federally recognized Indian tribe or an individual Indian.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Land-In-Trust Schools
- 5 and Local Governments Equitable Compensation Act".

1 SEC. 2. MANDATORY PAYMENTS FOR CERTAIN LAND HELD 2 IN TRUST.

3 (a) AGREEMENT.—As soon as practicable after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of the Interior 4 5 (referred to in this section as the "Secretary") shall attempt to negotiate an agreement among the applicable 6 7 local education agency or unit of local government, the 8 Secretary, the appropriate State, and, if appropriate, any 9 federally recognized Indian tribe or individual Indian, under which all parties agree that the amounts described 10 in subsection (b) shall be— 11

12 (1) waived in whole or in part;

- 13 (2) limited for an agreed upon number of years;14 or
- 15 (3) otherwise adjusted, including adjusting the16 timing of any payments.

17 (b) TRANSFER OF AMOUNTS.—If an agreement is not entered into under subsection (a), for the first fiscal year 18 19 beginning after the date of enactment of this Act and each fiscal year thereafter, the Secretary of the Treasury shall 20 transfer directly to the Secretary of Interior from the gen-21 22 eral fund of the Treasury, without further appropriation, 23 such amounts as are necessary, after taking into account 24 any other amounts appropriated to make payments under this subsection, to make payments from the Secretary to 25 26 the applicable local educational agency or unit of local gov-

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1 ernment in an amount necessary to ensure that the local 2 educational agency or unit of local government receives 3 full payment for the amount of property tax revenues lost 4 as a result of land under the jurisdiction of the local edu-5 cational agency or unit of local government being held in trust by the United States for the benefit of a federally 6 7 recognized Indian tribe or an individual Indian, to be calculated in a manner that provides that the taxes (other-8 9 wise payable but for the status of the land being held in 10 trust) shall be assessed and paid annually at the same rate 11 as the taxes would be assessed and paid if not in trust. 12 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Act shall apply to all land taken into trust by
the United States for the benefit of a federally recognized
Indian tribe or an individual Indian on or after October
1, 2008.

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
