- 6 (a) Expansion of Transfer Eligibility.—Dur-
- 7 ing the one-year period beginning on the date that is 30

2	member shall be deemed to be an eligible individual under
3	subsection (b) of section 3319 of title 38, United States
4	Code, for purposes of such section.
5	(b) Transfer and Use of Transferred Bene-
6	FITS.—Except as provided by subsection (a), the transfer
7	and use of any entitlement to educational assistance under
8	chapter 33 of title 38, United States Code, transferred
9	pursuant to this section shall otherwise be carried out in
10	accordance with section 3319 of such title to the maximum
11	extent feasible.
12	(c) COVERED MEMBER DEFINED.—In this section,
13	the term "covered member" means an individual who—
14	(1) is entitled to educational assistance under
15	chapter 33 of title 38, United States Code; and
16	(2) is—
17	(A) a member of the Armed Forces (in-
18	cluding the reserve components) who has com-
19	pleted an aggregate of more than 10 years of
20	active duty service; or
21	(B) a veteran who served an aggregate of
22	more than 10 years of active duty service.
