A BILL

To provide for the safe disposal of Federal Governmentowned transuranic waste for the benefit of all Americans.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Government Waste5 Isolation Pilot Plant Extension Act of 2011".

6 SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF WASTE ISOLATION PILOT PLANT 7 MISSION.

8 The Secretary of Energy shall manage WIPP in such9 a way as to include, in addition to the disposal of wastes

authorized by section 213 of the Department of Energy 1 National Security and Military Applications of Nuclear 2 3 Energy Authorization Act of 1980 (Pub. L. 96–164; 93) 4 Stat. 1259, 1265), the transportation and disposal of any 5 non-defense Federal Government-owned transuranic waste 6 that can be shown to meet the applicable criteria described in the document entitled "Transuranic Waste Acceptance 7 8 Criteria For The Waste Isolation Pilot Plant", published 9 by the Department of Energy on April 21, 2011, or any 10 successor document.

11 SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.

12 In this Act:

(1) DISPOSAL; TRANSURANIC WASTE.—The
terms "disposal" and "transuranic waste" have the
meanings given those terms in section 2 of the
Waste Isolation Pilot Plant Land Withdrawal Act
(Pub. L. 102–579; 106 Stat. 4777).

(2) WIPP.—The term "WIPP" means the
Waste Isolation Pilot Plant project authorized under
section 213 of the Department of Energy National
Security and Military Applications of Nuclear Energy Authorization Act of 1980 (Pub. L. 96–164; 93
Stat. 1259, 1265).
