A BILL

To prevent States from prohibiting male circumcision.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Religious and Parental
- 5 Rights Defense Act of 2011".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress finds the following:
- 8 (1) Male circumcision carries significant med-
- 9 ical benefits, including lower risk of sexually-trans-
- mitted diseases, certain kinds of infection, and over-
- all improved hygiene.

1	(2) Male circumcision is an important part of
2	many world religions, including Judaism and Islam,
3	and observers have safely embraced its practice for
4	generations.
5	SEC. 3. PREEMPTION OF STATE LAW PROHIBITING MALE
6	CIRCUMCISION.
7	No State or political subdivision of a State may adopt
8	or continue in force a law, regulation, or order that pro-
9	hibits or regulates the circumcision of males who have not
10	attained the age of 18 years and whose parent or guardian
11	has consented to the circumcision, unless such law, regula-
12	tion, or order—
13	(1) applies to all such circumcisions performed
14	in the State; and
15	(2) is limited to ensuring that all such
16	circumcisions are performed in a hygienic manner.
