A BILL

To suspend the issuance of visas to nationals of Brazil until such time as Brazil amends its laws to remove the prohibition on extradition of nationals of Brazil to other countries.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3 SECTION 1. SUSPENSION OF VISAS FOR BRAZILIANS UNTIL
4 BRAZIL AMENDS ITS LAWS TO REMOVE THE
5 PROHIBITION ON EXTRADITION OF NATION6 ALS OF BRAZIL TO OTHER COUNTRIES.
7 (a) SUSPENSION OF VISA ISSUANCE.—Notwith-

standing any other provision of law, no immigrant or non-

- 1 immigrant visa may be issued to a citizen, subject, na-
- 2 tional, or resident of Brazil until the President of the
- 3 United States determines and certifies to the Congress
- 4 that the Government of Brazil has amended its laws to
- 5 remove the prohibition on extradition of nationals of
- 6 Brazil to other countries.
- 7 (b) Waiver.—The President may waive the applica-
- 8 tion of subsection (a) on a case-by-case basis if the Presi-
- 9 dent determines and certifies to the Congress that it is
- 10 in the national interests of the United States to do so.
- 11 (c) Effect of Unauthorized Issuance.—Any
- 12 visa issued in violation of this subsection shall be null and
- 13 void.
