A BILL

To prohibit the enforcement of a climate change interpretive guidance issued by the Securities and Exchange Commission, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Maintaining Agency
- 5 Direction on Financial Fraud Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. INTERPRETIVE GUIDANCE NULL AND VOID.
- 7 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no inter-
- 8 pretive guidance issued by the Securities and Exchange
- 9 Commission on or after the effective date of this Act relat-

- 1 ing to "Commission Guidance Regarding Disclosure Re-
- 2 lated to Climate Change", affecting Parts 211, 231, and
- 3 249 of title 17, Code of Federal Regulations (as described
- 4 in Commission Release Nos. 33-9106; 34-61469; FR-
- 5 82), or any successor thereto, may take effect, and such
- 6 guidance shall have no force or effect with respect to any
- 7 person on or after February 2, 2010.

8 SEC. 3. OTHER SEC ACTION PROHIBITED.

- 9 (a) Further Guidance Related to Climate
- 10 Change.—The Commission may not issue any interpre-
- 11 tive guidance with respect to disclosures related to climate
- 12 change on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 13 (b) Voluntary Submissions.—The Commission
- 14 may not issue any interpretive guidance that would estab-
- 15 lish any requirements with respect to the content of or
- 16 format for any disclosures related to climate change volun-
- 17 tarily submitted by any entity to the Commission on or
- 18 after the effective date of this Act.
- 19 (c) Civil and Administrative Actions.—No civil
- 20 or administrative action or proceeding pertaining to disclo-
- 21 sures related to climate change may be initiated by the
- 22 Commission on or after the date of the enactment of this
- 23 Act and any such actions or proceedings pending on such
- 24 date shall be terminated.

1	(d) Rule of Construction.—Nothing in this sec-
2	tion shall be construed as to—
3	(1) prohibit the Commission from issuing inter-
4	pretive guidance with respect to disclosures related
5	to non-anthropogenic or natural climate variability
6	observed over comparable time periods; or
7	(2) terminate an administrative action or pro-
8	ceeding pertaining to such disclosures.

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
