- 6 SEC. 2. INCREASE IN MAXIMUM PENALTY FOR CERTAIN IN-
- 7 TENTIONALLY FALSE STATEMENTS RELAT-
- 8 ING TO FIREARMS.
- 9 Section 924(a) of title 18, United States Code, is
- 10 amended—

1	(1) in paragraph (1), by striking subparagraph
2	(A) and redesignating subparagraphs (B) through
3	(D) as subparagraphs (A) through (C), respectively,
4	and
5	(2) by adding at the end the following:
6	"(8) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection
7	subsection (b), (c), (f), or (p) of this section, or in section
8	929, whoever knowingly makes any false statement or rep-
9	resentation with respect to the information required by
10	this chapter to be kept in the records of a person licensed
11	under this chapter or in applying for any license or exemp-
12	tion or relief from disability under this chapter shall be
13	fined under this title, imprisoned not more than 10 years
14	or both.".

18	Section 1956(c)(7)(D) of title 18, United States
19	Code, is amended by inserting after "section 922(1) (relat-
20	ing to the unlawful importation of firearms)," the fol-
