A BILL

To amend the Older Americans Act of 1965 to provide social service agencies with the resources to provide services to meet the unique needs of Holocaust survivors to age in place with dignity, comfort, security, and quality of life.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Holocaust Survivors
- 5 Assistance Act of 2011".

TITLE I—PURPOSES; FINDINGS; DEFINITIONS; GRANTS

3	SEC. 101. PURPOSES.
4	The purposes of this Act are—
5	(1) to include "older individuals who are Holo-
6	caust survivors" to the list of groups that receive
7	preference for services as defined in section
8	305(a)(2)(E) of the Older Americans Act of 1965,
9	(2) to designate within the Administration on
10	Aging an individual to have responsibility for older
11	individuals who are Holocaust survivors, and
12	(3) to create a grant program to increase and
13	improve transportation services for older individuals
14	with preference to those older individuals who are
15	Holocaust survivors.
16	SEC. 102. FINDINGS.
17	The Congress finds the following:
18	(1) During the Holocaust, which took place be-
19	tween 1933 and 1945, an estimated $6,000,000$ Jews,
20	as well as millions from other targeted groups, were
21	murdered by the Nazis and their collaborators.
22	(2) Approximately 127,000 Holocaust survivors
23	remain in the United States, and thousands pass
24	away each year.

- 1 (3) Holocaust survivors are getting older and
 2 frailer, and will be seeking additional support and
 3 assistance from social service providers to enable
 4 them to age in place. Providers face increased levels
 5 of demand from vulnerable individuals without any
 6 additional revenue to cover needed services.
 - (4) All Holocaust survivors are at least 65 years old with approximately three quarters of them older than 75 and a majority in their 80s and 90s.
 - (5) More than half of all Holocaust survivors who emigrated to the United States from the former Soviet Union after 1965 fall beneath 200 percent of the Federal poverty threshold and constitute an extremely vulnerable at-risk population in the United States.
 - (6) Holocaust survivors continue to live with the mental and physical scars of the unconscionable trauma caused by the Holocaust.
 - (7) While institutionalized settings are beneficial for some older people, long-term care facilities can have an adverse effect on Holocaust survivors. For many Holocaust survivors, institutionalized settings reintroduce sights, sounds, smells, emotions and routines which can induce panic, anxiety, and

1	re-traumatization as a result of experiences resulting
2	from the Holocaust.
3	(8) Approximately two-thirds of Holocaust sur-
4	vivors live alone and living alone is a risk factor for
5	institutionalization.
6	(9) Low income Holocaust survivors are more
7	reliant on social service programs than most other
8	older Americans, with proportionally more Holocaust
9	survivors needing services such as personal care,
10	home-delivered and congregate meals, transpor-
11	tation, counseling and mental health support.

13	"(a) In General.—The Assistant Secretary shall
14	award grants or contracts to nonprofit organizations to
15	improve and increase transportation services for older in-
16	dividuals, with preference toward those older individuals
17	who are Holocaust survivors. The Assistant Secretary
18	shall make grants or enter into such contracts for period
19	of not less than 5 years.
20	"(b) Use of Funds.—
21	"(1) In general.—A nonprofit organization
22	receiving a grant or contract under subsection (a)
23	shall use the funds received through such grant or
24	contract to carry out a demonstration project, or to
25	provide technical assistance to assist local transit

providers, area agencies on aging, senior centers, and local senior support groups, to encourage and facilitate coordination of Federal, State, and local transportation services and resources for older individuals who are Holocaust survivors. The organization may use the funds to develop and carry out an innovative transportation demonstration project to create transportation services for older individuals.

- "(2) Specific activities.—In carrying out a demonstration project or providing technical assistance under paragraph (1) the organization may carry out activities that include—
 - "(A) developing innovative approaches for improving access by older individuals to transportation services, including volunteer driver programs, economically sustainable transportation programs, and programs that allow older individuals to transfer their automobiles to a provider of transportation services in exchange for the services;
 - "(B) preparing information on transportation options and resources for older individuals and organizations serving such individuals, and disseminating the information by estab-

lishing and operating a toll-free telephone number;

"(C) developing models and best practices for providing comprehensive integrated transportation services for older individuals, including services administered by the Secretary of Transportation, by providing ongoing technical assistance to agencies providing services under title III and by assisting in coordination of public and community transportation services; and "(D) providing special services to link older individuals to transportation services not provided under title III.

"(c) Preference.—In awarding grants and entering into contracts under paragraph (a), the Assistant Secretary shall give preference to organizations and institutions that have previous extensive experience working with and conducting assessment of the needs of Holocaust survivors who are older individuals.

"(d) Consultation.—In determining the type of 21 programs and activities used to improve and increase 22 transportation assistance for Holocaust survivors, the As-23 sistant Secretary shall consult with the individual des-24 ignated by Section 201(h)(1) of the Act and with national

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- 1 organizations with special expertise in serving Holocaust
- 2 survivors who are older individuals.
- 3 "(e) Eligible Entities.—To be eligible to receive
- 4 a grant or enter into a contract under paragraph (a), an
- 5 entity shall have previous extensive experience working
- 6 with and conducting assessment of the needs of older indi-
- 7 viduals.
- 8 "(f) Report to Congress.—The Assistant Sec-
- 9 retary with assistance from the individual designated by
- 10 Section 201 (h)(1) of the Act, shall prepare and submit
- 11 to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the
- 12 President pro tempore of the Senate an annual report on
- 13 the status and needs, including the priority areas of con-
- 14 cern, of older individuals who are Holocaust survivors.".

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
