A BILL

To provide for the furnishing of statues by the District of Columbia and territories of the United States for display in the United States Capitol.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FURNISHING OF STATUES FOR UNITED STATES
- 4 CAPITOL BY DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA AND
- 5 TERRITORIES.
- 6 (a) IN GENERAL.—The President is authorized to in-
- 7 vite each jurisdiction described in section 4 to provide and
- 8 furnish a statue, in marble or bronze, of a deceased person
- 9 who has been a citizen of the jurisdiction, and illustrious

1	for his or her historic renown or for distinguished civic
2	or military services, such as the jurisdiction may deem to
3	be worthy of this national commemoration; and when so
4	furnished, the same shall be placed in the United States
5	Capitol.
6	(b) Limitation.—No statue of any individual may
7	be placed in the United States Capitol pursuant to this
8	Act until after the expiration of the 10-year period which
9	begins on the date of the individual's death.
10	SEC. 2. REPLACEMENT OF STATUES.
11	(a) Request by Jurisdiction.—
12	(1) In general.—A jurisdiction described in
13	section 4 may request the Joint Committee on the
14	Library to approve the replacement of a statue the
15	jurisdiction has provided for display in the United
16	States Capitol under section 1.
17	(2) Conditions.—A request shall be consid-
18	ered under paragraph (1) only if—
19	(A) the request has been approved by a
20	resolution adopted by the legislature of the ju-
21	risdiction (or its equivalent) and the request
22	has been approved by the chief executive of the
23	jurisdiction; and
24	(B) the statue to be replaced has been dis-
25	played in the United States Capitol for at least

- 1 10 years as of the time the request is made, ex-2 cept that the Joint Committee may waive this 3 requirement for cause at the request of the ju-
- 4 risdiction.
- 5 (b) AGREEMENT UPON APPROVAL.—If the Joint
- 6 Committee on the Library approves a request under sub-
- 7 section (a), the Architect of the Capitol shall enter into
- 8 an agreement with the jurisdiction involved to carry out
- 9 the replacement in accordance with the request and any
- 10 conditions the Joint Committee may require for its ap-
- 11 proval. Such agreement shall provide that—
- 12 (1) the new statue shall be subject to the same
- conditions and restrictions as apply to any statue
- provided by the jurisdiction under section 1; and
- 15 (2) the jurisdiction shall pay any costs related
- to the replacement, including costs in connection
- 17 with the design, construction, transportation, and
- placement of the new statue, the removal and trans-
- portation of the statue being replaced, and any un-
- veiling ceremony.
- 21 (c) Limitation on Number of Statues.—Nothing
- 22 in this section shall be interpreted to permit any jurisdic-
- 23 tion described in section 4 to have more than 1 statue
- 24 on display in the United States Capitol.
- 25 (d) Ownership of Replaced Statues.—

- 1 (1) Transfer of ownership.—Subject to the 2 approval of the Joint Committee on the Library, 3 ownership of any statue replaced under this section 4 shall be transferred to the jurisdiction involved.
- 5 (2) PROHIBITING SUBSEQUENT DISPLAY IN
 6 CAPITOL.—If any statue is removed from the United
 7 States Capitol as part of a transfer of ownership
 8 under paragraph (1), it may not be returned to the
 9 Capitol for display unless such display is specifically
 10 authorized by Federal law.

11 SEC. 3. PLACEMENT OF STATUES.

- The Architect of the Capitol, upon the approval of
- 13 the Joint Committee on the Library and with the advice
- 14 of the Commission of Fine Arts as requested, is authorized
- 15 and directed to provide for the reception, location, and re-
- 16 location of any statues received on or after the date of
- 17 the enactment of this Act from a jurisdiction in accord-
- 18 ance with this Act.

19 SEC. 4. JURISDICTIONS DESCRIBED.

- The jurisdictions described in this section are as fol-
- 21 lows:
- 22 (1) The District of Columbia.
- 23 (2) The Commonwealth of Puerto Rico.
- 24 (3) Guam.
- 25 (4) American Samoa.

- 1 (5) The United States Virgin Islands.
- 2 (6) The Commonwealth of the Northern Mar-

iana Islands.

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
