1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Education and Energy3 Act of 2011".

4 SEC. 2. USE OF REVENUES FROM NEW MINERAL AND GEO5 THERMAL LEASE AUTHORITY FOR PAYMENTS 6 TO STATES FOR USE FOR EDUCATION.

7 Section 35(a) of the Mineral Leasing Act (30 U.S.C.
8 191) is amended by inserting "(1)" before the first sen9 tence, and by adding at the end the following new para10 graph:

11 ((2)(A) Of amounts otherwise required under 12 paragraph (1) to be deposited into the general fund 13 of the Treasury each fiscal year that are derived 14 from leases for tracts located in a State, the Sec-15 retary shall pay to the State 33 percent for use for 16 the education of students in grades kindergarten 17 through grade 12 and at institutions of higher edu-18 cation.

19 "(B) Of the amounts otherwise required under 20 paragraph (1) to be deposited into the general fund 21 of the Treasury each fiscal year that are not re-22 quired to be used for payments under subparagraph 23 (A) of this paragraph, the Secretary shall pay to 24 States, in equal amounts, 17 percent for use for the 25 education of students in grades kindergarten

1	through grade 12 and at institutions of higher edu-
2	cation.
3	"(C)(i) Subparagraphs (A) and (B) shall apply
4	only with respect to amounts that—
5	"(I) are received by the United States
6	under leases entered into under authority
7	granted to the Secretary after the date of en-
8	actment of the Education and Energy Act of
9	2011; and
10	"(II) exceed the amount of revenues that
11	the Secretary of the Treasury previously esti-
12	mated would be received under such leases in
13	the fiscal year.
14	"(ii) In calculating estimates referred to in
15	clause (i)(II), the Secretary of the Treasury shall
16	consult with the Congressional Budget Office.
17	"(D) Subparagraphs (A) and (B) shall not
18	apply with respect to amounts required by para-
19	graph (1) to be paid into, reserved, and appro-
20	priated, as part of the reclamation fund.".

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
