A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Commerce to establish a grant program to provide veterans with apprenticeships and career advice.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Help Inspire and Re-
- 5 train our Exceptional Veterans Act of 2011" or the
- 6 "HIRE Veterans Act of 2011".
- 7 SEC. 2. GRANT PROGRAM TO PROVIDE VETERANS WITH AP-
- 8 PRENTICESHIPS AND CAREER ADVICE.
- 9 (a) Establishment.—Subject to the availability of
- 10 appropriations provided for such purpose, the Secretary

- 1 of Commerce, in consultation with the Secretary of Vet-
- 2 erans Affairs, shall establish a program to award grants
- 3 to local Chambers of Commerce to provide veterans with
- 4 apprenticeships and career advice.
- 5 (b) USE OF GRANT.—A local Chamber of Commerce
- 6 may use a grant awarded under this section to establish
- 7 a veterans apprenticeship program that provides veterans
- 8 (particularly those who served in Operation Enduring
- 9 Freedom, Operation Iraqi Freedom, or Operation New
- 10 Dawn) with—
- 11 (1) training with respect to writing a résumé;
- 12 (2) career advice; and
- 13 (3) opportunities to pursue apprenticeships with
- businesses participating in the program.
- 15 (c) Number and Amount of Grants.—
- 16 (1) Number.—The Secretary may not award
- more than one grant to a local Chamber of Com-
- 18 merce during each five-year period in which the
- 19 grant program established under subsection (a) is
- 20 carried out.
- 21 (2) Amount.—A grant awarded under this sec-
- tion shall be an amount that is not less than
- \$10,000 and not more than \$20,000.
- 24 (d) APPLICATION.—To be eligible for a grant under
- 25 this section, a local Chamber of Commerce shall submit

- 1 to the Secretary an application at such time, in such man-
- 2 ner, and containing such information as the Secretary may
- 3 require.
- 4 (e) Termination.—The grant program established
- 5 under subsection (a) shall terminate on September 30,
- 6 2022.
- 7 (f) Annual Report.—Not later than March 31 of
- 8 each year following a year in which a grant is awarded
- 9 under this section, the Secretary shall submit to Congress
- 10 a report on the grant program, including—
- 11 (1) a list of each grant awarded in the year cov-
- ered by the report, including the amount of the
- grant and the local Chamber of Commerce awarded
- the grant; and
- 15 (2) the number of veterans who participated in
- a program described in subsection (b) who became
- employed during such year, including whether such
- 18 employment is considered permanent or temporary.
- 19 (g) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
- 20 authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary to carry
- 21 out this section a total of \$10,000,000.
