A BILL

To provide for a 10 percent reduction in pay for Members of Congress.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. REDUCTION IN PAY FOR MEMBERS OF CON-

GRESS.

5 (a) REDUCTION.—Notwithstanding any other provi6 sion of law, the annual rate of pay for each Member of
7 Congress shall be as follows:

8 (1) For pay periods during the period beginning
9 October 1, 2011, and ending December 31, 2012,

the applicable rate in effect as of the date of the en actment of this Act.

3 (2) For pay periods occurring during 2013, the
4 applicable rate during the period described in para5 graph (1) reduced by 10 percent, rounded to the
6 nearest multiple of \$100 (or, if midway between
7 multiples of \$100, to the next higher multiple of
8 \$100).

9 (3) For subsequent pay periods, the applicable
10 rate during 2013, subject to adjustment under para11 graph (2) of section 601(a) of the Legislative Reor12 ganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 31(2)).

(b) MEMBER OF CONGRESS DEFINED.—For purposes of this Act, the term "Member of Congress" means
an individual serving in a position under subparagraph
(A), (B), or (C) of section 601(a) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 31).
