 - **3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "American Jobs Preser-
 - 5 vation Act".

1 SEC. 2. HIGHWAYS.

2 Section 313 of title 23, United States Code, is
3 amended—

4 (1) by redesignating subsections (c) through (f)
5 as subsections (d) through (g), respectively;

6 (2) by inserting after subsection (b) the fol-7 lowing:

8 "(c) REQUIREMENTS FOR ISSUANCE OF PUBLIC IN-9 TEREST WAIVER.—The Secretary may issue a waiver based on a finding under subsection (b)(1) only after the 10 11 Secretary has considered the potential impacts of the waiver on domestic manufacturing employment. The Sec-12 13 retary shall include a statement detailing the short and long-term impact of the finding on domestic manufac-14 turing employment.". 15

16 SEC. 3. TRANSIT.

17 Section 5323(j) of title 49, United States Code, is18 amended—

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Secretary has considered the potential impacts of the
 waiver on domestic manufacturing employment. The Sec retary shall include a statement detailing the short and
 long-term impact of the finding on domestic manufac turing employment.".
