- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Detainee Trials at
- 5 Gitmo Act".

1	SEC. 2. DETENTION FACILITY AT NAVAL STATION, GUANTA-
2	NAMO BAY, CUBA TO REMAIN OPEN AND RE-
3	QUIREMENT THAT INDIVIDUALS DETAINED
4	AT THAT FACILITY BE TRIED ONLY BY MILI-
5	TARY COMMISSION.
6	(a) DETENTION FACILITY.—The detention facility at
7	Naval Station, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba shall remain in
8	use indefinitely by the United States as a detention facil-
9	ity.
10	(b) Trial by Military Commission.—Any indi-
11	vidual who is detained at Naval Station, Guantanamo
12	Bay, Cuba, as of the date of the enactment of this Act,
13	may only be tried by military commission under chapter
14	47A of title 10, United States Code. Any trial of such an
15	individual by military commission shall be conducted at
16	Naval Station, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.
