# A BILL

- To establish the Harriet Tubman National Historical Park in Auburn, New York, and the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad National Historical Park in Caroline, Dorchester, and Talbot Counties, Maryland, and for other purposes.

15	owner of any land within the historical park to
16	mark, interpret, or restore nationally significant
17	historic or cultural resources relating to the life
18	of Harriet Tubman, if the agreement provides
19	that—
20	(i) the Secretary shall have the right
21	of access to any public portions of the land
22	covered by the agreement to allow for—
23	(I) access at reasonable times by
24	historical park visitors to the land;
25	and

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(II) interpretation of the land for
the public; and
(ii) no changes or alterations shall be
made to the land except by mutual agree-
ment of the Secretary and the owner of the
land.
(B) RESEARCH.—The Secretary may enter
into a cooperative agreement with the State, po-
litical subdivisions of the State, institutions of
higher education, the Home and other nonprofit
organizations, and individuals to conduct re-
search relating to the life of Harriet Tubman.
(C) ATTORNEY GENERAL.—
(i) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall
submit to the Attorney General for review
any cooperative agreement under this
paragraph involving religious property or
property owned by a religious institution.
(ii) FINDING.—No cooperative agree-
ment subject to review under this subpara-
graph shall take effect until the date on
which the Attorney General issues a find-
ing that the proposed agreement does not
violate the Establishment Clause of the
First Amendment to the Constitution.
