3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Removing Barriers to
- 5 Colorectal Cancer Screening Act of 2012".

1 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

2 Congress finds the following:

3 (1) Colorectal cancer is the second leading
4 cause of cancer death among men and women in the
5 United States.

6 (2) It is estimated that 143,460 new cases of
7 colorectal cancer are expected to occur in 2012.

8 (3) More than 50,000 people in the United
9 States are expected to die from colorectal cancer in
10 2012.

(4) It is estimated that if all precancerous polyps were identified and removed before becoming
cancerous, estimates show the number of new
colorectal cancer cases could be reduced by 76 to 90
percent and deaths could be reduced by 70 to 90
percent.

17 (5) Although colorectal cancer is largely pre18 ventable, one in three adults between the ages of 50
19 and 75 are not up to date with recommended
20 colorectal cancer screening.

21 (6) Two-thirds of colorectal cancer cases are diagnosed in patients over the age of 65.

(7) Colorectal cancer screening colonoscopy is a
highly effective preventive service, and removing financial barriers can help to increase rates of screening.

1 SEC.3. WAIVING MEDICARE COINSURANCE FOR2COLORECTAL CANCER SCREENING TESTS.

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3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1833(a)(1)(Y) of the So4 cial Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1395l(a)(1)(Y)) is amended
5 by inserting ", including tests and procedures described
6 in the last sentence of subsection (b)," after "section
7 1861(ddd)(3)".

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
9 subsection (a) shall apply to items and services furnished
10 after the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
