#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "None of Our Funds
3 in the Interest or for the Exercise or Leisure of Detainees
4 Act" or the "NO FIELD Act".

# 5 SEC. 2. SENSE OF CONGRESS REGARDING USE OF FUNDS 6 FOR RECREATIONAL FACILITIES FOR GUAN7 TANAMO DETAINEES.

8 It is the sense of the Congress that the Department 9 of Defense should not use taxpayer funds to provide rec-10 reational facilities for individuals detained at United 11 States Naval Station, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.

## 12 SEC. 3. REDUCTION OF DOD DISCRETIONARY SPENDING 13 LIMIT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2013.

The discretionary spending limit for the security category for fiscal year 2013 in section 251(c)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 17 1985 (as revised pursuant to section 251A(2) of such Act) 18 is reduced by \$750,000.

#### 19 SEC. 4. USE OF SAVINGS FOR DEFICIT REDUCTION.

Any savings to the Federal Government resulting
from section 3 shall be retained in the Treasury for purposes of deficit reduction.
