1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Land Acquisition to3 cut National Debt Act" or the "LAND Act".

4 SEC. 2. DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR LAND ACQUISI-5 TION.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Interior may 7 not use Federal funds to purchase land that would result 8 in a net increase of land acreage that would be under the 9 jurisdiction of the National Park Service, the U.S. Fish 10 and Wildlife Service, or the Bureau of Land Management 11 unless the Federal budget is balanced for the year in 12 which the land would be purchased.

(b) DUCK STAMP FUNDS.—Subsection (a) shall not
apply to land purchased with funds made available
through the sale of Federal Migratory Bird Hunting and
Conservation Stamps.

17 SEC. 3. NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM LAND ACQUISITION.

18 The Secretary of Agriculture may not use Federal 19 funds to purchase land that would result in a net increase 20 of land acreage included in the National Forest System 21 unless the Federal budget is balanced for the year in 22 which the land would be purchased.
