- 2 member from automatic separation under this subsection
- 3 until that member becomes 60 years of age, so long as
- 4 the member undergoes a physical examination during the
- 5 6-month period which ends on the day the member turns
- 6 57 years of age and, on the basis of the examination,
- 7 meets appropriate physical fitness criteria (as determined
- 8 by the Board in consultation with the Chief of the Capitol
- 9 Police and the exclusive representative of the Capitol Po-
- 10 lice under chapter 71 of title 5, United States Code, with
- 11 respect to collective bargaining).".
