13	the receipt of a grant or cooperative agreement

16	strategy, a State or an eligible entity designated by
17	a State pursuant to subsection (b)(1)(B) shall agree
18	to consult with each Federally recognized Indian
19	tribe and tribal organization (as defined in the In-
20	dian Self-Determination and Education Assistance
21	Act) and each urban Indian organization (as defined
22	in the Indian Health Care Improvement Act) regard-
23	ing such development or implementation.".
