# A BILL

To amend the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act to designate segments of the mainstem of the Nashua River and its tributaries in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for study for potential addition to the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2   *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3   **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       *This Act may be cited as the “Nashua River Wild and*  
5   *Scenic River Study Act”.*

6   **SEC. 2. DESIGNATION FOR STUDY.**

7       *Section 5(a) of the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (16*  
8   *U.S.C. 1276(a)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-*  
9   *lowing:*

10       “(      ) NASHUA RIVER, MASSACHUSETTS.—

11       (A) *The approximately 19-mile segment of the*  
12   *mainstem of the Nashua River from the confluence of*  
13   *the North and South Nashua Rivers in Lancaster,*  
14   *Massachusetts, north to the Massachusetts/New Hamp-*  
15   *shire State line, and its tributaries, except the ap-*  
16   *proximately 4.8-mile segment of the mainstem of the*  
17   *Nashua River from the Route 119 bridge in Groton,*  
18   *Massachusetts downstream to its confluence with the*  
19   *Nissitissit River in Pepperell, Massachusetts.*

20       “(B) *The 10-mile segment of the Squannacook*  
21   *River from its headwaters at Ash Swamp downstream*  
22   *to its confluence with the Nashua River in Shirley/*  
23   *Ayer, Massachusetts.*

24       “(C) *The 3.5-mile segment of the Nissitissit*  
25   *River from the Massachusetts/New Hampshire State*

1       *line downstream to its confluence with the Nashua  
2       River in Pepperell, Massachusetts.”.*

3   **SEC. 3. STUDY AND REPORT.**

4       *Section 5(b) of the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (16  
5   U.S.C. 1276(b)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-  
6   lowing:*

7           “(      ) **STUDY AND REPORT.**—Not later than 3  
8   years after the date on which funds are made avail-  
9   able to carry out this paragraph, the Secretary of the  
10   Interior shall complete the study of the Nashua River  
11   in Massachusetts and New Hampshire, as described  
12   in subsection (a)(      ), and submit a report de-  
13   scribing the results of that study to the Committee on  
14   Natural Resources of the House of Representatives  
15   and the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources  
16   of the Senate.”.

17   **SEC. 4. REPORT REQUIREMENTS.**

18       *The report required under section 3 of this Act shall—*

19           *(1) include a discussion of the effect of the des-  
20   ignation of the area to be studied under this Act  
21   under the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act on—*

22           *(A) existing commercial and recreational  
23   activities, such as hunting, fishing, trapping,  
24   recreational shooting, motor boat use, or bridge  
25   construction;*

1                   (B) the authorization, construction, operation,  
2                   maintenance, or improvement of energy  
3                   production and transmission infrastructure; and

4                   (C) the authority of State and local governments  
5                   to manage those activities encompassed in  
6                   subparagraphs (A) and (B); and

7                   (2) identify—

8                   (A) all authorities that will authorize or require  
9                   the Secretary of the Interior to influence  
10                  local land use decisions (such as zoning) or place  
11                  restrictions on non-Federal land if the area studied  
12                  under this Act is designated under the Wild  
13                  and Scenic Rivers Act;

14                  (B) all authorities that the Secretary of the  
15                  Interior may use to condemn property if the  
16                  area studied under this Act is designated under  
17                  the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act; and

18                  (C) all private property located in the area  
19                  to be studied under this Act.
