Ms. Velázquez introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To direct the Secretary concerned to develop and implement policies and procedures to prevent and respond to hazing in the Armed Forces, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Service Member Anti-
- 5 Hazing Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY CONCERNED.
- 7 (a) Hazing Policies and Procedures.—The Sec-
- 8 retary concerned, in consultation with the Panel estab-
- 9 lished in section 3, shall—

- 1 (1) develop and implement a policy to prevent 2 and respond to hazing of members of that branch of 3 the Armed Forces;
 - (2) develop and implement a program to train members of that branch of the Armed Forces on the dangers of and the need to avoid hazing and on issues related to diversity, which each such member shall attend not less than annually;
 - (3) expand any policies for reporting incidents of hazing to include a phone service through which an individual can anonymously call to report incidents of hazing in that branch of the Armed Forces; and
 - (4) develop and implement a procedure to transfer a member of that branch of the Armed Forces who has been the victim of a substantiated incident of hazing to another unit in such branch of the Armed Forces.
- (b) Data Collection.—The Secretary concerned
 shall collect and maintain data on each incident of hazing
 reported, including—
- 22 (1) the gender, race or ethnicity, sexual orienta-23 tion, and religion of the victim and perpetrator of 24 the incident of hazing; and

2	to the incident of hazing, and if there was a re-
3	sponse, information about such response.
4	(c) Report.—The Secretary concerned shall submit
5	an annual report to Congress on the data collected and
6	maintained under subsection (b).
7	SEC. 3. MILITARY HAZING PREVENTION OVERSIGHT
8	PANEL.
9	(a) Establishment.—There is established a panel
10	to be known as the Military Hazing Prevention Oversight
11	Panel (in this Act referred to as the "Panel").
12	(b) Membership.—The Panel shall be composed of
13	the following members:
14	(1) The Secretary of the Army or the Sec-
15	retary's designee.
16	(2) The Secretary of the Navy or the Sec-
17	retary's designee.
18	(3) The Secretary of the Air Force or the Sec-
19	retary's designee.
20	(4) The Secretary of Homeland Security (with
21	respect to the Coast Guard) or the Secretary's des-
22	ignee.
23	(5) Members appointed by the Secretary of De-
24	fense from among individuals who are not officers or

employees of any government and who have exper-1 2 tise in advocating for— 3 (A) women; 4 (B) racial or ethnic minorities; (C) religious minorities; or 6 (D) gay, lesbian, bisexual, or transgender 7 individuals. (c) Duties.—The Panel shall— 8 9 (1) make recommendations to the Secretary 10 concerned on the development of the policies, pro-11 grams, and procedures described in section 2(a); and 12 (2) monitor the policies, programs, and proce-13 dures described in section 2(a) and make rec-14 ommendations to the Secretary concerned, based on 15 the data collected in section 2(b), on ways to im-16 prove such policies, programs, and procedures. 17 (d) Initial Meeting.—Not later than 180 days 18 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Panel shall hold its initial meeting. 19 20 (e) Meetings.—The Panel shall meet not less than 21 annually. 22 SEC. 4. DEFINITIONS. 23 (a) Hazing.—The term "hazing" means any conduct whereby a member of the Armed Forces, regardless of branch or rank, without proper authority causes another

- 1 member to suffer, or be exposed to, any activity which is
- 2 cruel, abusive, humiliating, oppressive, demeaning, or
- 3 harmful, and includes—
- 4 (1) soliciting or coercing another individual to
- 5 perpetrate any such activity;
- 6 (2) verbal or psychological conduct; and
- 7 (3) instances in which the victim of such activ-
- 8 ity gave actual or implied consent.
- 9 (b) Secretary Concerned.—The term "Secretary
- 10 concerned" has the meaning given the term in section
- 11 101(a) of title 10, United States Code.
