A BILL

To provide for supplemental appropriations for obesity programs of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR OBE-**
4 **SITY PROGRAMS OF THE CENTERS FOR DIS-**
5 **EASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION.**

6 The following sums are appropriated, out of any
7 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for fis-
8 cal year 2013:

1 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN
2 SERVICES
3 CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION

4 For an additional amount for obesity programs, as
5 authorized by section 301 of the Public Health Service
6 Act, \$20,000,000, to remain available until expended: *Pro-*
7 *vided*, That such amount is designated by the Congress
8 as an emergency requirement pursuant to section
9 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
10 Deficit Control Act of 1985, except that such amount shall
11 be available only if the President subsequently so des-
12 ignates such amount and transmits such designation to
13 the Congress.

14 **SEC. 2. RESCISSIONS.**

15 Of the prior year unobligated balances of the fol-
16 lowing accounts, the following amounts are rescinded:

17 (1) “Department of State and Related Agen-
18 cy—Department of State—Administration of For-
19 eign Affairs—Educational and Cultural Exchange
20 Programs”, \$6,000,000.

21 (2) “Department of State and Related Agen-
22 cy—Department of State—International Organiza-
23 tions—Contributions to International Organiza-
24 tions”, \$5,000,000.

1 (3) “Bilateral Economic Assistance—Funds
2 Appropriated to the President—Assistance For Eu-
3 rope, Eurasia and Central Asia”, \$5,000,000.

4 (4) “Multilateral Assistance—Funds Appro-
5 priated to the President—Contribution to the Stra-
6 tegic Climate Fund”, \$1,000,000.

7 (5) “Multilateral Assistance—Funds Appro-
8 priated to the President—Global Environment Facil-
9 ity”, \$1,000,000.

10 (6) “Multilateral Assistance—Funds Appro-
11 priated to the President—Contribution to the Inter-
12 American Development Bank”, \$2,000,000.
