A BILL

- To direct the Secretary of Energy to establish a pilot program to award grants and loan guarantees to hospitals to carry out projects for the purpose of reducing energy costs and increasing resilience to improve security.

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Hospital Energy Inde-5 pendence Act".

3 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Secretary of Energy
4 shall establish a pilot program to award grants and loan
5 guarantees to hospitals to carry out energy conservation
6 projects for the purpose of—

7 (1) significantly improving the energy efficiency8 of such hospitals; and

9 (2) encouraging onsite power generation and
10 energy storage, capable of operating independent of
11 the grid, and providing sufficient onsite emergency
12 backup power for essential hospital functions.

(b) NUMBER OF HOSPITALS.—The Secretary shall
award grants and loan guarantees under the pilot program
to no more than 6 hospitals during the period described
in subsection (f).

(c) APPLICATIONS.—A hospital seeking a grant or
loan guarantee under the pilot program shall submit an
application to the Secretary at such time, in such manner,
and accompanied by such information as the Secretary
may require.

(d) CONSIDERATIONS.—In selecting a hospital to
award a grant or loan guarantee to under the pilot program, the Secretary shall give special consideration to applications from such hospitals that can demonstrate that

they are able to commence an energy conservation project
 more promptly.

3 (e) REPORT.—Not later than 2 years after the date 4 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit 5 to Congress a report on the implementation of the pilot 6 program. Such report shall include information that would 7 allow for Congress to evaluate the effectiveness of the pilot 8 program and to advance best practices.

9 (f) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

10 (1) The terms "hospital" has the meaning given 11 such term in section 391 of the Energy Policy and 12 Conservation Act (42 U.S.C. 6371), and also in-13 cludes academic facilities that specialize in scientific 14 research, provide patient care, and serve as health 15 and medical education centers.

16 (2) The term "energy conservation project" has
17 the meaning given such term in section 391 of the
18 Energy Policy and Conservation Act (42 U.S.C.
19 6371).

(g) RECISSION; SOURCE OF FUNDING.—Of the unobligated balances of the discretionary appropriations made
available by division A of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (Public Law 111–5), there are rescinded and made available \$90,000,000 to carry out the

1 pilot program, which shall be committed during fiscal

2 years 2011 and 2012.
