To direct the Secretary of Defense to establish policies and guidelines to ensure civilian and military law enforcement personnel charged with security functions on military installations will receive Active Shooter Training.

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Military Active Shooter
5 Training Act of 2011”.

1 **SEC. 2. ACTIVE SHOOTER TRAINING FOR PERSONNEL RE-**
2 **SPONSIBLE FOR FRONT-LINE INSTALLATION**
3 **SECURITY.**

4 The Secretary of Defense shall establish policy and
5 promulgate guidelines to ensure civilian and military law
6 enforcement personnel charged with security functions on
7 military installations will receive Active Shooter Training
8 as described in finding 4.3 of the document entitled “Pro-
9 tecting the Force: Lessons From Fort Hood”.
