Mr. McGovern (for himself, Mr. Issa, and Mr. Boustany) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Armed Services

## A BILL

To limit the use of cluster munitions.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Cluster Munitions Ci-
- 5 vilian Protection Act of 2011".
- 6 SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON THE USE OF CLUSTER MUNITIONS.
- 7 No funds appropriated or otherwise available to any
- 8 Federal department or agency may be obligated or ex-
- 9 pended to use any cluster munitions unless—
- 10 (1) the submunitions of the cluster munitions,
- after arming, do not result in more than 1 percent

1	unexploded ordnance across the range of intended
2	operational environments; and
3	(2) the policy applicable to the use of such clus-
4	ter munitions specifies that the cluster munitions
5	will only be used against clearly defined military tar-
6	gets and will not be used where civilians are known
7	to be present or in areas normally inhabited by civil-
8	ians.
9	SEC. 3. PRESIDENTIAL WAIVER.
10	The President may waive the requirement under sec-
11	tion 2(1) if, prior to the use of cluster munitions, the
12	President—
13	(1) certifies that it is vital to protect the secu-
14	rity of the United States; and
15	(2) not later than 30 days after making such
16	certification, submits to the appropriate congres-
17	sional committees a report, in classified form if nec-
18	essary, describing in detail—
19	(A) the steps that will be taken to protect
20	civilians; and
21	(B) the failure rate of the cluster muni-
22	tions that will be used and whether such muni-
23	tions are fitted with self-destruct or self-deacti-
24	vation devices.

## 1 SEC. 4. CLEANUP PLAN.

- 2 Not later than 90 days after any cluster munitions
- 3 are used by a Federal department or agency, the President
- 4 shall submit to the appropriate congressional committees
- 5 a plan, prepared by such Federal department or agency,
- 6 for cleaning up any such cluster munitions and submuni-
- 7 tions which fail to explode and continue to pose a hazard
- 8 to civilians.
- 9 SEC. 5. APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES DE-
- 10 FINED.
- In this Act, the term "appropriate congressional com-
- 12 mittees" means the Committee on Foreign Relations, the
- 13 Committee on Armed Services, and the Committee on Ap-
- 14 propriations of the Senate and the Committee on Foreign
- 15 Affairs, the Committee on Armed Services, and the Com-
- 16 mittee on Appropriations of the House of Representatives.
