RESOLUTION

- Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that the Office of Management and Budget should direct all Federal agencies to postpone for one year the implementation of major rules.
- Whereas job creation continues to be a top priority for Congress and the American people;
- Whereas the economic recovery is, according to the President and other executive branch officials, "fragile" and "uncertain";

- Whereas estimates put the cost of overbearing and onerous Federal regulations at over \$1 trillion per year;
- Whereas, in a time of record deficits and debt, the Government's responsibility is to alleviate these fiscal pressures on American families, not to exacerbate them; and
- Whereas Congress and the Administration need to redouble their efforts to create simple, effective regulation with specific intent: Now, therefore, be it
 - Resolved, That it is the sense of the House of Rep resentatives that the Office of Management and Budget
 should direct all Federal agencies to postpone for one year
 the implementation of major rules that restrict economic
 growth, except for those rules that provide for emergency
 services or the defense of the Nation.

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
