A BILL

To provide for additional Federal district judgeships.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Emergency Judicial
- 5 Relief Act of 2011".

SEC. 2. FEDERAL DISTRICT JUDGESHIPS.

- 3 SHIP.—The President shall appoint, by and with the ad-
- 4 vice and consent of the Senate—
- 5 (1) 2 additional district judges for the district
- 6 of Arizona;
- 7 (2) 4 additional district judges for the eastern
- 8 district of California;
- 9 (3) 1 additional district judge for the district of
- Minnesota;
- 11 (4) 1 additional district judge for the southern
- district of Texas; and
- 13 (5) 2 additional district judges for the western
- 14 district of Texas.
- 15 (b) Conversion of Temporary Judgeships.—The
- 16 existing judgeships for the district of Arizona and the cen-
- 17 tral district of California authorized by section 312(c) of
- 18 the 21st Century Department of Justice Appropriations
- 19 Authorization Act (28 U.S.C. 133 note; Public Law 107–
- 20 273; 116 Stat. 1788), as of the effective date of this Act,
- 21 shall be authorized under section 133 of title 28, United
- 22 States Code, and the incumbents in those offices shall hold
- 23 the office under section 133 of title 28, United States
- 24 Code, as amended by this Act.

- 1 (1) In General.—Section 1914(a) of title 28, 2 United States Code, is amended by striking "\$350" 3 and inserting "\$360".
- Expenditure LIMITATION.—Incremental 5 amounts collected by reason of the enactment of this 6 subsection shall be deposited in a special fund in the 7 Treasury to be established after the date of enactment 8 of this Act. Such amounts shall be available for the 9 purposes specified in section 1931(a) of title 28, 10 United States Code, but only to the extent specifically 11 appropriated by an Act of Congress enacted after the 12 date of enactment of this Act.

13 SEC. 3. WHISTLEBLOWER PROTECTION.

(a) In General.—No officer, employee, agent, con-14 15 tractor, or subcontractor in the judicial branch may discharge, demote, threaten, suspend, harass or in any other 16 manner discriminate against an employee in the terms and 17 conditions of employment because of any lawful act done 18 by the employee to provide information, cause information 19 to be provided, or otherwise assist in an investigation regarding any possible violation of Federal law or regulation, or misconduct, by a judge, justice, or any other employee in the judicial branch, which may assist in the investigation of the possible violation or misconduct.

- 1 (b) Civil Action.—An employee injured by a viola-
- 2 tion of subsection (a) may, in a civil action, obtain appro-
- 3 priate relief.
