A BILL

To reauthorize the Combating Autism Act of 2006 (Public Law 109–416).

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Combating Autism Re-3 authorization Act".

4 SEC. 2. CONTINUATION OF PROGRAMS RELATING TO AU-5 TISM.

6 Part R of title III of the Public Health Service Act
7 (42 U.S.C. 280i et seq.) is amended—

8 (a) in section 399AA(e), by striking "2011" and in9 serting "2014";

10 (b) in section 399BB(g), by striking "2011" and in-11 serting "2014";

12 (c) in section 399CC(f), by striking "2011" and in-13 serting "2014"; and

14 (d) by inserting after section 399DD the following:
15 "SEC. 399DD-1. REPORT TO CONGRESS ON REAUTHORIZA16 TION.

"(a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 2 years after the 17 date of enactment of the Combating Autism Reauthoriza-18 19 tion Act, the Secretary, in coordination with the Secretary 20 of Education, shall prepare and submit to the Committee 21 on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions of the Senate 22 and the Committee on Energy and Commerce of the 23 House of Representatives a progress report on activities 24 related to autism spectrum disorder and other develop-25 mental disabilities.

"(b) CONTENTS.—The report submitted under sub-1 2 section (a) shall include— 3 "(1) a description of the progress made in im-4 plementing the provisions of the Combating Autism 5 Act of 2006; 6 "(2) a description of the amounts expended on 7 the implementation of each particular provision of 8 the Combating Autism Act of 2006; 9 "(3) information on the incidence of autism 10 spectrum disorder and trend data of such incidence 11 since the date of enactment of the Combating Au-12 tism Act of 2006; "(4) information on the average age of diag-13 14 nosis for individuals with autism spectrum disorder 15 and other disabilities, including how that age may 16 have changed during the 6-year period beginning on 17 the date of enactment of the Combating Autism Act 18 of 2006; 19 "(5) information on the average age for inter-20 vention for individuals diagnosed with autism spec-21 trum disorder and other developmental disabilities, 22 including how that age may have changed during the 23 6-year period beginning on the date of enactment of

the Combating Autism Act of 2006;

1 "(6) information on the average time between 2 initial screening for autism spectrum disorder and 3 diagnosis of, or the ruling out of, autism spectrum disorder or other developmental disabilities, and in-4 formation on the average time between diagnosis 5 6 and evidence-based intervention for individuals with 7 autism spectrum disorder or other developmental 8 disabilities;

9 "(7) information on the effectiveness and out-10 comes of interventions for individuals diagnosed with 11 autism spectrum disorder, including information 12 with respect to various subtypes of autism spectrum 13 disorder and other developmental disabilities and 14 how the age of the individual so diagnosed may af-15 fect such effectiveness;

"(8) information on the effectiveness and outcomes of innovative and newly developed intervention
strategies for individuals with autism spectrum disorder or other developmental disabilities; and

"(9) information on services and supports provided to individuals with autism spectrum disorder
and other developmental disabilities who have
reached the age of majority (as described in section
615(m) of the Individuals with Disabilities Education
cation Act (20 U.S.C. 1415(m)).".

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1 SEC. 3. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS. 2 Section 399EE of the Public Health Service Act (42) 3 U.S.C. 280i–4) is amended— (a) in subsection (a) (relating to developmental dis-4 5 abilities surveillance and research program), by adding at the end the following: 6 7 "(6) For each of fiscal years 2012, 2013, and 2014, \$22,000,000."; 8 9 (b) in subsection (b) (relating to autism education, 10 early detection, and intervention), by adding at the end the following: 11 "(6) For each of fiscal years 2012, 2013, and 12 2014, \$48,000,000."; and 13 (c) in subsection (c) (relating to interagency autism 14 coordinating committee; certain other programs), by add-15 ing at the end the following: 16 17 "(6) For each of fiscal years 2012, 2013, and 18 2014, \$161,000,000.".

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
