- 5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1303 of the SAFETEA—
- 6 LU (23 U.S.C. 101 note; 119 Stat. 1207) is amended—

1	(1) in subsection (a), by striking "motor vehi-
2	cles" and inserting "motor vehicles and freight and
3	passenger rail";
4	(2) in subsection (b), in paragraphs (1), (3),
5	(4), and (5), by inserting ", rail," after "motor vehi-
6	cle" each place it appears;
7	(3) in subsection (d), in the matter preceding
8	paragraph (1), by inserting ", rail," after "motor ve-
9	hicle''; and
10	(4) in subsection (g)—
11	(A) by redesignating paragraph (5) as
12	paragraph (6); and
13	(B) by inserting after paragraph (4) the
14	following:
15	"(5) Rail.—The term 'rail' means railroad (as
16	defined in section 10102 of title 49, United States
17	Code).".
18	(b) Reauthorization.—Section 1101(a)(11) of the
19	SAFETEA-LU (119 Stat. 1155) is amended by striking
20	subparagraphs (A) through (E) and inserting the fol-
21	lowing:
22	"(A) $$230,000,000$ for fiscal year 2011;
23	and
24	"(B) for fiscal year 2012 and each fiscal
25	year thereafter through 2015, the amount for

the prior fiscal year increased by the rate of inflation (as measured by the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (United States city average) published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the Department of Labor).".
