A BILL

To exempt any road, highway, or bridge damaged by a natural disaster, including a flood, from duplicative environmental document reviews if the road, highway, or bridge is reconstructed in the same location.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. EXEMPTION.
- 4 The reconstruction process of any road, highway, or
- 5 bridge that is in operation or under construction when
- 6 damaged by a natural disaster, including a flood, and re-
- 7 constructed in the same location shall be exempt from any
- 8 environmental review under—

14	U.S.C. 1531 et seq.), except when the reconstruction
