1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Health Emergencies3 Lack Provider Specialists Act of 2011".

4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

5 Congress makes the following findings:

6 (1) In communities facing environmental health 7 hazards that have been declared a public health 8 emergency (pursuant to section 104(a) of the Com-9 prehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, 10 and Liability Act of 1980), it is increasingly difficult 11 for the health care facilities in those areas to recruit 12 the specialists necessary to treat the particular 13 health needs of the residents. As a result, these com-14 munities and their populations are medically under-15 served.

16 (2) Since 1970, the National Health Service
17 Corps has helped communities recruit health care
18 professionals who are committed to serving the
19 needs of underserved populations.
