3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "West Coast Ocean Pro-
- 5 tection Act of 2011".

SEC. 2. PROHIBITION OF OIL AND GAS LEASING ON THE OUTER CONTINENTAL SHELF OFF THE COAST OF CALIFORNIA, OREGON, AND WASHINGTON. Section 8 of the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act (43 U.S.C. 1337) is amended by adding at the end the following:

"(q) PROHIBITION OF OIL AND GAS LEASING IN
8 CERTAIN AREAS OF THE OUTER CONTINENTAL SHELF.—
9 Notwithstanding any other provision of this section or any
10 other law, the Secretary of the Interior shall not issue a
11 lease for the exploration, development, or production of
12 oil or natural gas in any area of the outer Continental
13 Shelf off the coast of the State of California, Oregon, or
14 Washington.".
