- To amend title 18, United States Code, to establish a criminal offense relating to fraudulent claims about military service.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Stolen Valor Act of5 2011".

SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF CRIMINAL OFFENSE RELATING TO CERTAIN MISREPRESENTATIONS ABOUT MILITARY SERVICE.

4 (a) MISREPRESENTATIONS ABOUT MILITARY SERV5 ICE.—Chapter 47 of title 18, United States Code, is
6 amended by adding at the end the following new section:
7 "§1041. Certain misrepresentations about military
8 service.

9 "(a) OFFENSE.—Whoever, with intent to obtain any10 thing of value, knowingly makes a misrepresentation re11 garding his or her military service, shall—

"(1) if the misrepresentation is that such individual served in a combat zone, served in a special
operations force, or was awarded the Congressional
Medal of Honor, be fined under this title, imprisoned not more than 1 year, or both; and

17 "(2) in any other case, be fined under this title,18 imprisoned not more than 6 months, or both.

19 "(b) EXCEPTION FOR DENIAL OF SERVICE.—Sub20 section (a) does not apply to a misrepresentation that an
21 individual did not serve in the Armed Forces of the United
22 States.

23 "(c) DEFENSE.—It is a defense to a prosecution24 under this section if the thing of value is de minimis.

25 "(d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

1	"(1) Armed forces of the united
2	STATES.—The term 'Armed Forces of the United
3	States' means the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine
4	Corps, and Coast Guard, including the reserve com-
5	ponents named in section 10101 of title 10.
6	"(2) COMBAT ZONE.—The term 'combat zone'
7	has the meaning given such term in section
8	112(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.
9	"(3) Congressional medal of honor.—The
10	term 'Congressional Medal of Honor' has the mean-
11	ing given such term in section 704 of this title.
12	"(4) MILITARY SERVICE.—The term 'military
13	service' means—
14	"(A) service in the Armed Forces of the
15	United States;
16	"(B) service in a combat zone as a member
17	of the Armed Forces of the United States;
18	"(C) attainment of a specific rank in the
19	Armed Forces of the United States; and
20	"(D) receipt of—
21	"(i) any decoration or medal author-
22	ized by Congress for the Armed Forces of
23	the United States;

1	"(ii) any of the service medals or
2	badges awarded to members of such forces;
3	or
4	"(iii) the ribbon, button, or rosette of
5	any such badge, decoration, or medal.
6	"(5) Special operations force.—The term
7	'special operations force' has the meaning given such
8	term in section 167(i) of title 10.".
9	(b) Conforming Amendments.—Section 704 of
10	title 18, United States Code, is amended—
11	(1) by striking subsection (b);
12	(2) by redesignating subsections (c) and (d) as
13	subsections (b) and (c), respectively;
14	(3) in subsection $(b)(1)$, as redesignated by
15	paragraph (2), by striking "or (b)"; and
16	(4) in subsection (c), as redesignated by para-
17	graph (2), by striking "or (b)".
18	SEC. 3. CLERICAL AMENDMENT.
19	The table of sections at the beginning of chapter 47
20	of title 18, United States Code, is amended by adding at
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21 the end the following new item:

"1041. Certain misrepresentations about military service.".
