  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "PCAOB Enforcement
  - 5 Transparency Act of 2011".
  - 6 SEC. 2. OPEN MEETINGS AUTHORIZED.
  - 7 Section 105(c)(2) of the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002
  - 8 (15 U.S.C. 7215(c)(2)) is amended to read as follows:

- 1 "(2) Public Hearings.—Hearings under this 2 section shall be open to the public, unless the Board, 3 on its own motion or after considering the motion of 4 a party, orders otherwise.".
- 5 SEC. 3. PUBLICATION OF DETERMINATIONS.
- Section 105(d)(1)(C) of the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 7 2002 (15 U.S.C. 7215(d)(1)(C)) is amended by striking 8 "(once any stay on the imposition of such sanction has
