# A BILL

- To provide that Members of Congress may not receive pay after October 1 of any fiscal year in which Congress has not approved a concurrent resolution on the budget and passed the regular appropriations bills.

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "No Budget, No Pay5 Act".

#### 6 SEC. 2. DEFINITION.

7 In this section, the term "Member of Congress"—

1	(1) has the meaning given under section 2106
2	of title 5, United States Code; and
3	(2) does not include the Vice President.
4	SEC. 3. TIMELY APPROVAL OF CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
5	ON THE BUDGET AND THE APPROPRIATIONS

7	If both Houses of Congress have not approved a con-

If both Houses of Congress have not approved a con-8 current resolution on the budget as described under sec-9 tion 301 of the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C. 632) for a fiscal year before 10 October 1 of that fiscal year and have not passed all the 11 12 regular appropriations bills for the next fiscal year before 13 October 1 of that fiscal year, the pay of each Member of Congress may not be paid for each day following that Oc-14 15 tober 1 until the date on which both Houses of Congress approve a concurrent resolution on the budget for that fis-16 17 cal year and all the regular appropriations bills.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no funds may be appropriated or otherwise
be made available from the United States Treasury for
the pay of any Member of Congress during any period determined by the Chairpersons of the Committee on the

Budget and the Committee on Appropriations of the Sen ate or the Chairpersons of the Committee on the Budget
 and the Committee on Appropriations of the House of
 Representatives under section 5.

5 (b) NO RETROACTIVE PAY.—A Member of Congress may not receive pay for any period determined by the 6 7 Chairpersons of the Committee on the Budget and the 8 Committee on Appropriations of the Senate or the Chair-9 persons of the Committee on the Budget and the Com-10 mittee on Appropriations of the House of Representatives under section 5, at any time after the end of that period. 11 12 SEC. 5. DETERMINATIONS.

13 (a) Senate.—

(1) REQUEST FOR CERTIFICATIONS.—On October 1 of each year, the Secretary of the Senate shall
submit a request to the Chairpersons of the Committee on the Budget and the Committee on Appropriations of the Senate for certification of determinations made under paragraph (2) (A) and (B).

20 (2) DETERMINATIONS.—The Chairpersons of
21 the Committee on the Budget and the Committee on
22 Appropriations of the Senate shall—

23 (A) on October 1 of each year, make a de24 termination of whether Congress is in compli-

12	of the House of Representatives shall submit a re-
13	quest to the Chairpersons of the Committee on the
14	Budget and the Committee on Appropriations of the
15	House of Representatives for certification of deter-
16	minations made under paragraph (2) (A) and (B).
17	(2) Determinations.—The Chairpersons of
18	the Committee on the Budget and the Committee on
19	Appropriations of the House of Representatives
20	shall—
21	(A) on October 1 of each year, make a de-

(B) determine the period of days following
 each October 1 that Member of the House of
 Representatives may not be paid under section
 3; and

8 Officer of the House of Representatives.

10 This section shall take effect on February 1, 2013.

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
