Mr. LEVIN introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred
to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of Momo Krcic.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENT STATUS FOR MOMO**
4 **KRCIC.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding subsections (a)
6 and (b) of section 201 of the Immigration and Nationality
7 Act (8 U.S.C. 1151), Momo Krcic shall be eligible for an
8 immigrant visa or for adjustment of status to that of an
9 alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence upon fil-
10 ing an application for issuance of an immigrant visa under
11 section 204 of that Act (8 U.S.C. 1154) or for adjustment
12 of status to lawful permanent resident.

1 (b) ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS.—If Momo Krcic enters
2 the United States before the filing deadline set forth in
3 subsection (c), Momo Krcic shall be considered to have
4 entered and remained lawfully in the United States and
5 shall be eligible for adjustment to lawful permanent resi-
6 dent status under section 245 of the Immigration and Na-
7 tionality Act (8 U.S.C. 1255) as of the date of the enact-
8 ment of this Act.

9 (c) APPLICATION AND PAYMENT OF FEES.—Sub-
10 sections (a) and (b) shall apply only if the application for
11 issuance of an immigrant visa or for adjustment of status
12 are filed with appropriate fees not later than 2 years after
13 the date of the enactment of this Act.

14 (d) REDUCTION OF IMMIGRANT VISA NUMBERS.—
15 Upon granting immigrant visas or lawful permanent resi-
16 dent status to Momo Krcic, the Secretary of State shall
17 instruct the proper officer to reduce by one, during the
18 current or next following fiscal year, the total number of
19 immigrant visas that are made available to natives of the
20 country of birth of Momo Krcic under section 202(a)(2)
21 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
22 1152(a)(2)).
