Mr. NELSON of Florida (for himself, Mrs. BOXER, and Mr. KIRK) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations

A BILL

To authorize further assistance to Israel for the Iron Dome anti-missile defense system.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Iron Dome Support

5 Act".

6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

7 Congress makes the following findings:

8 (1) The State of Israel remains vulnerable to
9 attack from missiles, rockets, and mortar shells fired
10 at Israeli civilian targets by militants from the for-

eign terrorist organization Hamas on its southern
 border and by the foreign terrorist organization
 Hezbollah on its northern border. Past attacks have
 killed, wounded, or inflicted psychological trauma on
 countless Israeli citizens.

6 (2) The United States Government remains 7 committed to ensuring the Government of Israel's 8 qualitative military edge, including maintaining its 9 advantage over non-state actors such as Hezbollah 10 and Hamas who possess increasingly sophisticated 11 and powerful weapons as a result of support from 12 Iran, Syria, and other state actors.

(3) The Israeli Defense Forces recently reported that the Iron Dome anti-missile defense system has achieved a success rate of more than 90
percent, intercepting rockets bound for residential
neighborhoods, busy road junctions, shopping centers, and crowded streets in southern Israel.

19 (4) The high success rate of the Iron Dome
20 anti-missile defense system has helped avert signifi21 cant Israeli casualties.

(5) The United States can help to advance its
own vital national security interests and the cause of
peace and stability in the Middle East by supporting

1	Israel's ability to defend itself against missiles, rock-
2	ets, and other threats.
3	(6) In 2010, President Barack Obama re-
4	quested funds to help the State of Israel procure
5	and maintain Iron Dome missile batteries. Congress
6	then provided funding for the purchase of up to 10
7	Iron Dome systems.
8	(7) The Government of Israel currently has
9	three operational Iron Dome batteries deployed in
10	the field, which are insufficient to protect all of the
11	territory of Israel.
