A BILL

To amend the National Trails System Act to provide for the study of the Pike National Historic Trail.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Pike National Historic
- 5 Trail Study Act of 2011".
- 6 SEC. 2. WESTERN STATES TRAIL STUDY.
- 7 Section 5(c) of the National Trails System Act (16
- 8 U.S.C. 1244(c)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
- 9 lowing:

"(46) PIKE NATIONAL HISTORIC TRAIL.—The 1 2 Pike National Historic Trail, a series of routes ex-3 tending approximately 3,664 miles, which follows the 4 route taken by Lt. Zebulon Montgomery Pike during the 1806–1807 Pike expedition that began in Fort 5 Bellefontaine, Missouri, extended through portions 6 of the States of Kansas, Nebraska, Colorado, New 7 8 Mexico, and Texas, and ended in Natchitoches, Louisiana.". 9
