## A BILL

For the relief of Genesio Januario Oliveira.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 2 3 SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENT STATUS FOR GENESIO 4 JANUARIO OLIVEIRA. 5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding subsections (a) 6 and (b) of section 201 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1151), Genesio Januario Oliveira shall be 7 8 eligible for issuance of an immigrant visa or for adjust-9 ment of status to that of an alien lawfully admitted for 10 permanent residence upon filing an application for 11 issuance of an immigrant visa under section 204 of such

Act (8 U.S.C. 1154) or for adjustment of status to lawful
 permanent resident.

3 (b) ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS.—If Genesio Januario
4 Oliveira enters the United States before the filing deadline
5 specified in subsection (c), he shall be considered to have
6 entered and remained lawfully and shall, if otherwise eligi7 ble, be eligible for adjustment of status under section 245
8 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1255)
9 as of the date of the enactment of this Act.

10 (c) DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION AND PAYMENT OF FEES.—Subsections (a) and (b) shall apply only if the ap-11 12 plication for issuance of an immigrant visa or the applica-13 tion for adjustment of status is filed with appropriate fees within 2 years after the date of the enactment of this Act. 14 15 (d) REDUCTION OF IMMIGRANT VISA NUMBER.— Upon the granting of an immigrant visa or permanent res-16 idence to Genesio Januario Oliveira, the Secretary of State 17 shall instruct the proper officer to reduce by 1, during the 18 19 current or next following fiscal year, the total number of 20immigrant visas that are made available to natives of the 21 country of the alien's birth under section 203(a) of the 22 Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1153(a)) or, 23 if applicable, the total number of immigrant visas that are 24 made available to natives of the country of the alien's birth 25 under section 202(e) of such Act (8 U.S.C. 1152(e)).

(e) DENIAL OF PREFERENTIAL IMMIGRATION
 TREATMENT FOR CERTAIN RELATIVES.—The natural
 parents, brothers, and sisters of Genesio Januario Oliveira
 shall not, by virtue of such relationship, be accorded any
 right, privilege, or status under the Immigration and Na tionality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101 et seq.).
