3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Delisting Gray Wolves
- 5 to Restore State Management Act of 2011".

1SEC. 2. STATUS OF NORTHERN ROCKY MOUNTAIN DIS-2TINCT POPULATION SEGMENT OF THE GRAY3WOLF.

4 Notwithstanding any other provision of law (includ-5 ing regulations), effective beginning on the date of enactment of this Act, the final rule, entitled "Endangered and 6 7 Threatened Wildlife and Plants; Final Rule To Identify 8 the Northern Rocky Mountain Population of Gray Wolf as a Distinct Population Segment and To Revise the List 9 of Endangered and Threatened Wildlife" (74 Fed. Reg. 10 15123 (April 2, 2009)), shall have the full force and effect 11 12 of law.
