1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Alpine Lakes Wilder3 ness Additions and Pratt and Middle Fork Snoqualmie
4 Rivers Protection Act".

5 SEC. 2. EXPANSION OF ALPINE LAKES WILDERNESS.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—There is designated as wilderness and as a component of the National Wilderness Preserva-7 8 tion System certain Federal land in the Mount Baker-9 Snoqualmie National Forest in the State of Washington comprising approximately 22,173 acres that is within the 10 11 Proposed Alpine Lakes Wilderness Additions Boundary, as generally depicted on the map entitled "Proposed Al-12 pine Lakes Wilderness Additions" and dated December 3, 13 2009, which is incorporated in and shall be considered to 14 be a part of the Alpine Lakes Wilderness. 15

16 (b) Administration.—

17 (1) MANAGEMENT.—Subject to valid existing 18 rights, the land designated as wilderness by sub-19 section (a) shall be administered by the Secretary of 20 Agriculture (referred to in this section as the "Sec-21 retary"), in accordance with the Wilderness Act (16) 22 U.S.C. 1131 et seq.), except that any reference in 23 that Act to the effective date of that Act shall be 24 considered to be a reference to the date of enact-25 ment of this Act.

6 SEC. 3. WILD AND SCENIC RIVER DESIGNATIONS.

7 Section 3(a) of the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (16
8 U.S.C. 1274(a)) is amended by adding at the end the fol9 lowing:

"(208) MIDDLE FORK SNOQUALMIE, WASHINGTON.—The 27.4-mile segment from the headwaters of the Middle Fork Snoqualmie River near
La Bohn Gap in NE ¹/₄ sec. 20, T. 24 N., R. 13
E., to the northern boundary of sec. 11, T. 23 N.,
R. 9 E., to be administered by the Secretary of Agriculture in the following classifications:

"(A) The approximately 6.4-mile segment
from the headwaters of the Middle Fork
Snoqualmie River near La Bohn Gap in NE ¹/₄
sec. 20, T. 24 N., R. 13 E., to the west section
line of sec. 3, T. 23 N., R. 12 E., as a wild
river.

23 "(B) The approximately 21-mile segment
24 from the west section line of sec. 3, T. 23 N.,

1	R. 12 E., to the northern boundary of sec. 11,
2	T. 23 N., R. 9 E., as a scenic river.
3	"(209) PRATT RIVER, WASHINGTON.—The en-
4	tirety of the Pratt River in the State of Washington,
5	located in the Mount Baker-Snoqualmie National
6	Forest, to be administered by the Secretary of Agri-
7	culture as a wild river.".
