## A BILL

For the relief of Robert Liang and Alice Liang.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

**3** SECTION 1. ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-5 sion of law or any order, for the purposes of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101 et seq.), Robert 6 7 Liang and Alice Liang shall be deemed to have been law-8 fully admitted to, and remained in, the United States, and 9 shall be eligible for issuance of an immigrant visa or for adjustment of status under section 245 of the Immigra-10 tion and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1255). 11

(b) APPLICATION AND PAYMENT OF FEES.—Sub section (a) shall apply only if the applications for issuance
 of immigrant visas or the applications for adjustment of
 status are filed with appropriate fees not later than 2
 years after the date of the enactment of this Act.

6 (c) Reduction of Immigrant VISA Numbers.— 7 Upon the granting of immigrant visas to Robert Liang 8 and Alice Liang, the Secretary of State shall instruct the 9 proper officer to reduce by 2, during the current or subse-10 quent fiscal year, the total number of immigrant visas that are made available to natives of the country of birth of 11 Robert Liang and Alice Liang under section 203(a) of the 12 13 Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1153(a)), or, if applicable, the total number of immigrant visas that are 14 15 made available to natives of the country of birth of Robert Liang and Alice Liang under section 202(e) of that Act 16 (8 U.S.C. 1152(e)). 17

(d) PAYGO.—The budgetary effects of this Act, for
the purpose of complying with the Statutory Pay-As-YouGo Act of 2010, shall be determined by reference to the
latest statement titled "Budgetary Effects of PAYGO
Legislation" for this Act, submitted for printing in the
Congressional Record by the Chairman of the Senate

- 1 Budget Committee, provided that such statement has been
- 2 submitted prior to the vote on passage.
