## A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to prevent the Secretary of Veterans Affairs from prohibiting the use of service dogs on Department of Veterans Affairs property.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Veterans Equal Treat-
- 5 ment for Service Dogs Act of 2011" or the "VETS Dogs
- 6 Act of 2011".
- 7 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 8 Congress makes the following findings:

1	(1) The usage of medical service dogs among
2	veterans is increasing.
3	(2) The Department of Veterans Affairs cur-
4	rently allows seeing-eye dogs in Department facili-
5	ties.
6	(3) The Department does not place any limita-
7	tions on the access of seeing-eye dogs to Department
8	facilities.
9	(4) Titles II and III of the Americans with Dis-
10	abilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12131 et seq. and
11	12181 et seq.) require that a public entity or place
12	of public accommodation modify its policies, prac-
13	tices, and procedures to allow an individual with a
14	disability to use a service animal.
15	SEC. 3. USE OF SERVICE DOGS ON PROPERTY OF THE DE-
16	PARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS.
17	Section 1714 of title 38, United States Code, is
18	amended by adding at the end the following new sub-
19	section:
20	"(e) The Secretary may not prohibit the use of serv-
21	ice dogs provided under subsection (c) in any facility or
22	on any property of the Department or in any facility or
23	on any property that receives funding from the Sec-
