- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Hunting, Fishing, and
- 5 Recreational Shooting Protection Act".

1 SEC. 2. MODIFICATION OF DEFINITION.

2	Section 3(2)(B) of the Toxic Substances Control Act
3	(15 U.S.C. 2602(2)(B)) is amended—
4	(1) in clause (v), by striking ", and" and insert-
5	ing ", or any component of any such article includ-
6	ing, without limitation, shot, bullets and other pro-
7	jectiles, propellants, and primers,";
8	(2) in clause (vi) by striking the period at the
9	end and inserting ", and"; and
10	(3) by inserting after clause (vi) the following:
11	"(vii) any sport fishing equipment (as such
12	term is defined in subparagraph (a) of section 4162
13	of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986) the sale of
14	which is subject to the tax imposed by section
15	4161(a) of such Code (determined without regard to
16	any exemptions from such tax as provided by section
17	4162 or 4221 or any other provision of such Code),
18	and sport fishing equipment components.".
