A BILL

To provide for the eradication and control of nutria.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Nutria Eradication5 and Control Act of 2011".

1 SEC. 2. FINDINGS; PURPOSE.

2 Section 2 of the Nutria Eradication and Control Act
3 of 2003 (Public Law 108–16; 117 Stat. 621) is amend4 ed—

(1) in subsection (a)—

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6 (A) in paragraph (1), by striking "and in
7 Louisiana" and inserting ", the State of Lou8 isiana, and other coastal States";

9 (B) in paragraph (2), by striking "in 10 Maryland and Louisiana on Federal, State, and 11 private land" and inserting "on Federal, State, 12 and private land in the States of Maryland and 13 Louisiana and in other coastal States"; and

14 (C) by striking paragraphs (3) and (4) and15 inserting the following:

"(3) This Act authorizes the Maryland Nutria
Project, which has successfully eradicated nutria
from more than 130,000 acres of Chesapeake Bay
wetlands in the State of Maryland and facilitated
the creation of voluntary, public-private partnerships
and more than 406 cooperative landowner agreements.

23 "(4) This Act and the Coastal Wetlands Planning, Protection, and Restoration Act (16 U.S.C.
25 3951 et seq.) authorize the Coastwide Nutria Control Program, which has reduced nutria-impacted

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1 wetland acres in the State of Louisiana from 80,000 2 acres to 23,141 acres. "(5) The proven techniques developed under 3 4 this Act that are eradicating nutria in the State of 5 Maryland and reducing the acres of nutria-impacted 6 wetlands in the State of Louisiana should be applied to nutria eradication or control programs in other 7 8 nutria-infested coastal States"; and 9 (2) by striking subsection (b) and inserting the 10 following: 11 "(b) PURPOSE.—The purpose of this Act is to au-12 thorize the Secretary of the Interior to provide financial 13 assistance to the States of Delaware, Louisiana, Maryland, North Carolina, Oregon, Virginia, and Washington 14 15 to carry out activities— "(1) to eradicate or control nutria; and 16 17 "(2) to restore nutria damaged wetlands.". 18 **SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.** 19 The Nutria Eradication and Control Act of 2003 (Public Law 108–16; 117 Stat. 621) is amended— 20 21 (1) by redesignating sections 3 and 4 as sec-22 tions 4 and 5, respectively; and 23 (2) by inserting after section 2 the following: 24 **"SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.** 25 "In this Act:

1	"(1) COASTAL STATE.—The term 'coastal
2	State' means each of the States of Delaware, Or-
3	egon, North Carolina, Virginia, and Washington.
4	"(2) Program.—The term 'program' means
5	the nutria eradication program established by sec-
6	tion $4(a)$.
7	"(3) PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP.—The
8	term 'public-private partnership' means a voluntary,
9	cooperative project undertaken by governmental en-
10	tities or public officials and affected communities,
11	local citizens, nongovernmental organizations, or
12	other entities or persons in the private sector.
13	"(4) Secretary.—The term 'Secretary' means
14	the Secretary of the Interior.".
15	SEC. 4. NUTRIA ERADICATION PROGRAM.
16	Section 4 of the Nutria Eradication and Control Act
17	of 2003 (Public Law 108–16; 117 Stat. 621) (as redesig-
18	nated by section 3) is amended—
19	(1) by striking subsection (a) and inserting the
20	following:
21	"(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may, subject to
22	the availability of appropriations, provide financial assist-
23	ance to the States of Maryland and Louisiana and the
24	coastal States to implement measures—
25	"(1) to eradicate or control nutria; and

1	"(2) to restore wetlands damaged by nutria.";
2	(2) in subsection (b)—
3	(A) in paragraph (1), by inserting "the
4	State of" before "Maryland";
5	(B) in paragraph (2), by striking "other
6	States" and inserting "the coastal States"; and
7	(C) in paragraph (3), by striking "marsh-
8	land" and inserting "wetlands";
9	(3) in subsection (c)—
10	(A) by striking "(c) ACTIVITIES" and in-
11	serting "(c) Activities in the State of
12	MARYLAND"; and
13	(B) by inserting ", and updated in March
14	2009" before the period at the end;
15	(4) in subsection (e), by striking "financial as-
16	sistance provided by the Secretary under this sec-
17	tion" and inserting "the amounts made available
18	under subsection (f) to carry out the program"; and
19	(5) by striking subsection (f) and inserting the
20	following:
21	"(f) Authorization of Appropriations. Subject
22	to subsection (e), for each of fiscal years 2012 through
23	2016, there are authorized to be appropriated to the Sec-
24	retary to carry out the program such sums as are nec-
25	essary.

"(f) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—Subject 1 2 to subsection (e), there is authorized to be appropriated to 3 the Secretary to carry out the program \$6,000,000 for each 4 of fiscal years 2012 through 2016, of which— "(1) \$2,000,000 shall be used to provide finan-5 6 cial assistance to the State of Maryland; 7 "(2) \$2,000,000 shall be used to provide financial assistance to the State of Louisiana; and 8 9 "(3) \$2,000,000 shall be used to provide finan-10 cial assistance, on a competitive basis, to other coast-11 al States.".

12 SEC. 5. REPORT.

13 Section 5 of the Nutria Eradication and Control Act
14 of 2003 (Public Law 108–16; 117 Stat. 621) (as redesig15 nated by section 3) is amended—

(1) in paragraph (1), by striking "2002 document entitled 'Eradication Strategies for Nutria in
the Chesapeake and Delaware Bay Watersheds';
and" and inserting "March 2009 update of the document entitled 'Eradication Strategies for Nutria in
the Chesapeake and Delaware Bay Watersheds' and
the Chesapeake and Delaware Bay Watersheds' and
originally dated March 2002;";

23 (2) in paragraph (2)—

24 (A) by striking "develop" and inserting25 "continue"; and

1	(B) by striking the period at the end and
2	inserting "; and"; and

3 (3) by adding after paragraph (2) the following: "(3) develop, in cooperation with the State of 4 5 Delaware Department of Natural Resources and En-6 vironmental Control, the State of Virginia Depart-7 ment of Game and Inland Fisheries, the State of Or-8 egon Department of Fish and Wildlife, the State of 9 North Carolina Department of Environment and 10 Natural Resources, and the State of Washington De-11 partment of Fish and Wildlife, long-term nutria con-12 trol or eradication programs, as appropriate, with 13 the objective of—

14 "(A) significantly reducing and restoring
15 the damage nutria cause to coastal wetlands in
16 the coastal States; and

17 "(B) promoting voluntary, public-private
18 partnerships to eradicate or control nutria and
19 restoring nutria-damaged wetlands in the coast20 al States.".

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Reported with an amendment
